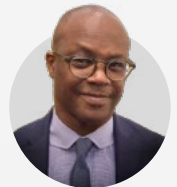

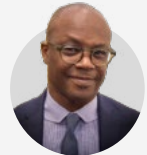

Miss Lina Antoun is a Consultant Gynaecologist at Birmingham Women's & Children's Hospital, specialising in minimal access surgery with a particular focus on endometriosis, advanced endoscopic procedures and colposcopy. She is recognised for her expertise in complex laparoscopic surgery and her commitment to advancing standards in minimally invasive gynaecology.

In 2022, she was elected to Council of the British Society for Gynaecological Endoscopy (BSGE), leading the trainee portfolio.

She was re-elected in 2024 as a Senior Council Member, overseeing the national laparoscopic training portfolio and contributing to the strategic development of surgical education across the UK.

Internationally, she serves as Chair of the Training and Education Special Interest Group at the European Society for Gynaecological Endoscopy (ESGE), where she plays a key role in shaping educational initiatives and advancing endoscopic training standards across Europe.

She has authored and co-authored numerous peer-reviewed publications and has presented her work widely at national and international scientific meetings. Her contributions to minimally invasive gynecological surgery have been recognized with multiple national and international awards.

Throughout her career, Lina has organized a wide range of training programs, workshops, and certification courses across multiple cities nationwide, collaborating with academic institutions, professional bodies, and industry experts to ensure high-quality learning experiences. Her national initiatives have focused on strengthening professional competencies, fostering innovation, and promoting best practices within the endoscopy field.

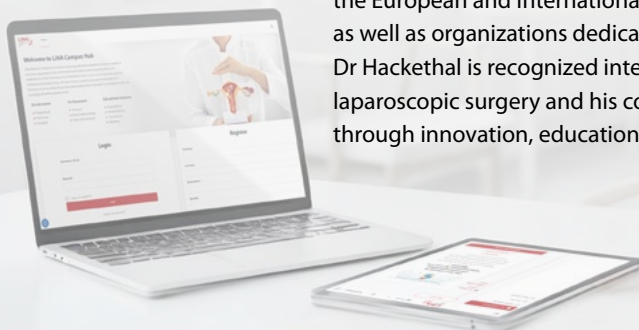

Mr Funlayo (Jimi) Odejinmi is a Consultant Gynaecologist based in London, United Kingdom, and Clinical Director of the Gynaecology Operational Delivery Network at Barts Health NHS Trust. He specializes in advanced minimally invasive (keyhole) surgery, including laparoscopic, robotic, and hysteroscopic techniques.

He has extensive expertise in the management of benign gynaecological conditions, particularly uterine fibroids, endometriosis, ovarian cysts, and menstrual disorders. His clinical approach is centred on minimally invasive, patient-focused care, with the aim of improving outcomes, reducing recovery time, and enhancing patient experience.

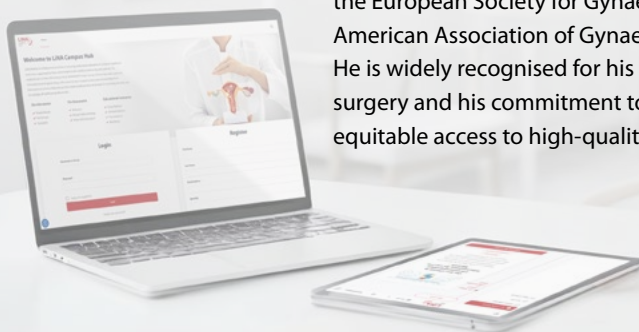
Mr Odejinmi is a Fellow of the Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists (FRCOG) and holds a Master's degree in Advanced Gynaecological Endoscopic Surgery. He trained in leading UK institutions alongside pioneers in laparoscopic surgery, shaping his expertise in complex and advanced procedures.

In addition to his clinical work, he is an Honorary Senior Lecturer at the Centre for Public Health and Policy, Wolfson Institute of Population Health, Queen Mary University of London. He has an extensive academic portfolio, with over 100 peer-reviewed publications, and is actively involved in research focused on improving outcomes and equity in women's health.

He is a regular faculty member at national and international courses and conferences, contributing to the training of the next generation of surgeons and advancing standards in minimally invasive gynaecology.

Mr Odejinmi is an active member of leading professional organisations, including the British Society for Gynaecological Endoscopy (BSGE), the European Society for Gynaecological Endoscopy (ESGE), and the American Association of Gynaecological Laparoscopists (AAGL).

He is internationally recognized for his expertise in minimally invasive gynecological surgery, including advanced laparoscopic and robotic techniques.

He plays a major role in surgical education as Head of Training at the International Center for Endoscopic Surgery (CICE) in Clermont-Ferrand, where he contributes to the development of next-generation surgical training programs.

Professor Rabischong has authored over 100 scientific publications and has delivered more than 250 invited lectures worldwide, reflecting his strong influence in the field.

He has held prominent leadership positions in international societies, including President of the International Society of Neupelvéologie (2020–2022) and President of the European Society for Gynaecological Endoscopy (ESGE). He currently serves as Director of the ESGE Academy.
